Prison Justice Day is August 10, a day set aside by prisoners to fast and refuse to work in a show of solidarity to remember those men, women and youth who have died behind the walls.

It is also a day to:

Raise public awareness of the demands made by prisoners to change the criminal justice system and the brutal and inhumane conditions that lead to so many prison deaths.

Remember that prisons are the ultimate form of oppression against struggles of liberation and self determination.

Publicize that, in their fight for freedom and equality, the actions of many political activists have been criminalized by government.

Oppose prison violence, police violence, and violence against women and children.

Raise issue with the fact that a very high rate of women are in prison for protecting themselves against their abusers.

Renew the struggle for adequate healthcare in prison, both prevention and treatment.

Educate people about the economic and social costs of a system of criminal justice which punishes for revenge.

Remind people that the criminal justice system and the psychiatric system are mutually reinforcing methods that the state uses to control human beings.
